Maki Itoi was born in Tokyo and she made her debut concert with a local orchestra already at her age nine. She studied at the Toho Gakuen School of Music. After receiving her Diplom in 1994, she went to Germany for her further study at the “Hochschule fuer Musik Detmold”. A year later, she moved to “Fondazione Romano Romanini” in Italy and later to Austria at the “Universitaet fuer Musik und darstellende Kunst Wien” from which she received the Master of Arts degree in 2004.

Maki Itoi has won the numerous awards in international violin competitions including the 1st prize of »Bela Bartok« (1997), 2nd prize of »Lipizer« (2002), 2nd prize of »Viotti« (2002), "Brescia"(2001), and further more she received the leading awards at „Trio di Trieste“ (1999), »Paganini« (1998) and »Vaclav Huml« (1997).

She also received the prominent scholarships from the Rohm Music Foundation Japan(1995-1997) and the Oversea Scholarships of Japan Cultural Ministry(1998-2000).

After she finished her study and research in the various universities and institutions, based in Vienna, she began to work as a concertmaster and a soloist appearing in the major music festivals such as; Bregenz, Evian, Kagan, Kazan, Osijek, Schleswig Holstein, Stari Grad, Tberi, Verbier, Warsaw, Wieniawsky, Brucknerhaus-Linz and Konzerthaus-Vienna. Thus her concert activities are widely extended to all over Europe and other countries such as; Austria, Croatia, France, Germany, Holland, Hungary, Israel, Italy, Poland, Slovakia, Slovenia, Switzerland, Russia, USA and Japan. Her solo performances were also appeared on the following radio and TV stations such as; ORF(Austria), RAI(Italy), NHK(Japan), TBS(Japan), National TV Poland, TV Hungary and Radio Moscow.

In 2005 she released her solo CD “YUKI MORIMOTO VIOLIN WORKS” from die Extraplatte, Vienna, Austria.

In 2012 Maki Itoi worked as a one of the juror members of the 31st International Violin Competition “Rodolfo Lipizer Prize”

She is currently working as a lecturer in the J.F. Oberlin University, Japan.

She speaks English, German, Italian and Japanese.
